Mark L Stamper (Music Director)

From South Carolina, Mark began his piano study at the age of three and eventually expanded his musical interests to include choral music.

He received a Batchelor of Music degree in Piano Performance from Winthrop University in 1986 where he studied with Dr Eugene Barban.

In 1989 Mark was awarded a Master of Music degree with a concentration in



Choral conducting from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas, where he was assistant conductor of the Oratorio Chorus.

Mark made his operatic conducting debut when he was granted the honour of being the first Conductor Apprentice to conduct an opera, Cavalleria Rusticana, with orchestra. He worked under the direction of Maestro William Weibel, a former conductor of the Metropolitan Opera in New York. He also conducted Cosi Fan Tutte with the South Florida Opera Company and the Gondoliers with Fort Worth Academy of Fine Arts.

In 2006 – 2007, he was the Principal Accompanist for La Boheme and Madame Butterfly with the Fort Worth Opera. Then in 2008, Mark was the Chorus Master for Lucia di Lammermoor and Of Mice and Men, where his chorus received great reviews from the critics.

He moved to Wellington New Zealand in 2015 and is now a resident in New Zealand. He is the artistic director/ founder of the professional choir Inspirare, directs Queen Margaret College Chorale's and four additional ensembles: SYLO, Wellington Young Voices, Wellington Male Voice Choir and the Wellington Youth Choir. He began conducting the Wellington Male Voice Choir in July 2019.

Mark's depth includes ballet, choral, opera, orchestral and musicals. His choirs have consistently received accolades from critics and judges at festivals and concerts.

WMVC Short History

The Choir was formed in 1961 as the Onslow Male Voice Choir and became the Wellington Male Voice Choir in 1992. We are in our 63rd year. We rehearse in Tawa on Monday evenings from February to November and aim to provide entertainment for others, to enjoy the pleasures and fellowship of male voice singing and to continually improve our standard as a choir. We sing at retirement villages and functions in the greater Wellington area including the Hutt Valley and Kapiti Coast.

WMVC have also participated in five New Zealand festivals of Male Voice Choirs held around New Zealand. In October 2003, the Choir made its first tour of Australia performing in Melbourne, Orange, and Narrogin WA. The choir has been to Nelson twice (2006 and 2008) to sing with the Nelson Male Voice Choir and the Sydney Male Choir.

In November 2010, we travelled to Sydney to take part in a festival in the Sydney Town Hall along with fifteen other Australian Male Voice Choirs. We also sang concerts in Orange, Inverell and Buderim.

In 2011 we celebrated our 50th anniversary with two joint concerts held with members of the Orange Male Voice Choir from NSW, and the Nelson Male Voice Choir. In November 2014 the choir again travelled to Australia to participate in the Australian "Let All Men Sing" 2014 Festival of Male Voices at AIS Arena, Canberra.

We have on several occasions held a joint concert in Feilding with "The Old Crotchets" and in June 2017 we sang in two concerts with the Whanganui Male Choir. In October 2017 some of our members travelled to Australia to participate in the MCAA Massed Male Choir Festival held in Wollongong. In November 2022 we celebrated the 90th anniversary of the Nelson Male Voice Choir with a joint concert in Nelson.
